

# Road Repair and Street Safety 2016 Phase 1 – Week of June 6 Pavement milling in Foxglenn Neighborhood and Pulliam Dr.

The Flagstaff City Council approved a construction contract with C and E Paving & Grading for the summer overlay (Phase 1) program in the amount of \$2,838,240.00, on March 22, 2016. This work is funded by the Proposition 406 Road Repair and Street Safety initiative approved by Flagstaff voters in 2014.

The City and C and E Paving started work in on our second year of improvements. Here are the streets that are receiving overlay work in Phase 1 (not shown on this map is Pulliam Drive):



With the majority of the concrete removals and replacements complete we are moving to the next phase of the project. The edge milling of the scheduled roadways to receive an overlay starts on Tuesday, June 7<sup>th</sup>. The milling process is scheduled to take three to four days. We also plan milling portions of Pulliam Drive later this week. The paving of these roadways is scheduled to start on Thursday, June 9<sup>th</sup> and continue throughout the week of June 13<sup>th</sup>.

Please note, the milling and paving operations will have a rolling traffic control with flaggers and traffic delays should be accounted for in your planning.

## The overlay improvement process is divided into eight basic steps:

- 1. Removal of damaged existing concrete improvements (i.e. curb / gutter, sidewalk and driveways and ADA ramps). Complete
- 2. Replacing of removed concrete. Complete
- 3. Lowering of existing water and sewer frames and lids. Complete
- 4. Milling of existing asphalt (primarily edges and transitions in and out of improvement areas).
- 5. Asphalt patching (where applicable).
- 6. Paving of the new asphalt overlay.
- 7. Raising of the existing water and sewer frames and lids.
- 8. Pavement striping (where applicable).

### **Notification & keeping you informed:**

Residents and businesses have been notified of the work and project signs are up. The public should expect traffic impacts in all areas throughout the week. The much needed road repairs will likely result in some temporary traffic restrictions, noise and dust. Every attempt will be made to maintain access to businesses and residences. The City apologizes for any inconveniences caused by the work. We appreciate the community's investment in our critical infrastructure and the public's cooperation. This work is scheduled for daytime hours and City contractors and instructed to keep impacts as minimal as possible.

This work is part of the voter approved Prop 406 dedicated sales tax for road repair and street safety improvements, more than \$100 million of infrastructure improvements scheduled to be completed over the next 20 years.

The City is committed to keeping our promise to our citizens to touch every street in Flagstaff and to keep everyone informed on the status of the project work.
